
Our Approach

Balouo Salo's Ethics Code

The Balouo Salo's Ethic Code is a tool based on 13 ethical principles and is made available to anyone directly or indirectly involved in our activities and projects. It defines an approach consistent with our humanitarian principles, guaranteeing honesty, transparency, reliability and excellence to the activities we carry out, without any third aim, but juts with the objective of improving the life conditions and creating self-sufficiency in compliance with international conventions on rights human.

Cooperating means doing things in a system of sharing principles and values, with the aim of achieving a common goal by defending friendship and solidarity to eliminate cultural barriers and all discrimina-

tion. Everyone has the right to life and health, and we want to create a world in which there is no disparity or discrimination, in which everyone can smile and look to tomorrow with serenity, giving a safe place to future generations.

Compliance with the Code of Ethics is verified by an Ethics Committee, which monitors and supervises the activities and effectiveness of the actions in the field and of the organizational system, evaluating the results and proposing where necessary any adjustments and / or updates on specific problems or critical issues found during the audits.

References of the values of the Ethics Code

CEBS refers to the principles stated in the international conventions listed below:

- The **universal declaration of human rights** is a document on human rights adopted by the United Nations General Assembly in its third session, on December 10, 1948 in Paris with resolution 219077A. 48 out of 58 members voted in favor. No country said no, but ten abstained. This document was to be applied in all member states, [1] and some legal experts claimed that this declaration became binding as part of customary international law and has been cited continuously for over 50 years in all countries.
- The **Conference adopts the Declaration on fundamental principles and rights in labour**: freedom of association, abolition of child labor, elimination of forced labor and discrimination. Juan Somavia from Chile is the first general manager of the ILO from the south of the world.
- The **African Charter on Human and Peoples' Rights** or the Banjul Charter is a convention adopted by the African Union, adopted in Nairobi on June 27, 1981 as part of the Conference by the Justice Ministers of the Organization of African Unity.
- The **UN Convention on the Rights of the Child** was approved by the United Nations General Assembly on November 20, 1989. It expresses a consensus on what the obligations of the States and the international community are towards children.
- The **Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women** (CEDAW) is an international convention adopted in 1979 by the United Nations General Assembly. International treaty on women's rights, entered into force on 3 September 1981.
- The **Sustainable Developments Goals** are the new Agenda for sustainable development that aims to eliminate extreme poverty by 2030, to ensure that the peoples who have fled to poverty do not fall back into it, this goal also includes measures to strengthen livelihood resilience and social security systems.
- **International human rights law** establishes an obligation for states to protect individuals and groups against human rights violations.

Balouo Salo's Framework for Sustainable Development

The Balouo Salo activities and projects are implemented in compliance with the values and principles of the Ethics Code and follow the indications of the "Balouo Salo's Framework for Sustainable Development". This is an intervention framework that defines the implementation practices and methodologies useful for obtaining the social, environmental and economic sustainability of the projects. The choice of the resources put in place, the materials, the language used, the techniques of transport, recycling, reuse and all the activities put in place are analyzed, studied and chosen according to a cycle of reflections that take the short into consideration, medium and

long term and the impact that each activity can have on the context. Therefore, each activity is chosen by minimizing the negative effects on the environment and on humans, optimizing the resources and qualities put in place (economic, environmental or human) and evaluating the reuse of projects at the end of their life cycle.

The "Balouo Salo's Framework for Sustainable Development" defines in detail the methodology for sustainable implementation, thus drawing inspiration from the "Sustainable Developments Goals" defined by the United Nations and adopted by major international organizations.

Impartiality and neutrality


Balouo Salo is a non-politic and non-religious association, operating without any distinction of nationality, gender, age, language, religion and race for the exclusive interest of the community according to the hierarchy of interventions and needs analyzed on the basis of surveys and technical experiences.

All the activities of the organization are impartial and neutral and dissociated from any discriminatory form thus avoiding any form of conflict, and where this is not possible operators and representatives are obliged and intermediary components to defend the sustainability of Balouo Salo projects and activities, building through the values of solidarity, impartiality, friendship, neutrality and cooperation an environment based on peace and cooperation between the various parties involved in a conflict of whatever nature it may be.

In the event of situations of impossible management due to political, religious or military forces, Balouo Salo is required to cancel its activities to dissociate itself from conflicts, avoiding any damage to its credibility, image and projects.

All operators are obliged to respect and observe the obligations mentioned in the CEBS both during their activities and in their private life, as Balouo Salo representatives, thus avoiding any type of conflict of family, political, religious or other interest, always acting and only in compliance with the values declared in the CEBS and the statutory purposes of Balouo Salo.

Lasts projects



Solar well with sewage treatment plant Sambacounda Santo, Senegal

Realization of a well powered by solar energy which draws from underground groundwater and equipped with an osmosis and UV purification system for decontamination, desalination and debacterization in order to supply totally drinkable water to over 3000 people in the village and surroundings.



To fight climatic change Adeane, Senegal

Creation of a new natural park by baobab, eucalyptus and Bamboo against desertification and climate change, to promote the maintenance of environmental conditions, to favorize the reduction of temperatures, the ascent of the aquifer and the creation of a positive microclimate.

Building of a Polyvalent Cultural Center Tanaff, Senegal

Construction of a polyvalent center for the promotion and conservation of Senegal's cultures and tractions, now at risk of disappearance. The project have multifunctional buildings to improve knowledge and education, and a exhibition space to protect and share ancient traditions.



Involving local communities within development Sedhiou, Senegal

Development of beneficiaries seem to be at crucial point, and for that we aim to enhance and focus on them in order to have an active participation on improving their skills on matters such as technical knowledge and maintenance and to create self-sufficiency and freedom of management.





Training program on ecosustainable architecture Tanaff, Senegal

Courses on engineering and architecture was carried out, devoted to a naturalistic and environmentally friendly approach, to sensitize and instruct new local construction operators towards more comfortable methods, economic and sustainable.



Donation of 12.000 pens to primary schools Arrossendissment de Simbandi, Senegal

Finding pens should be easy. Buit here children are not able to take notes and do homeworks due to lacking education equipment. Thanks to the support of Stilolinea company, we donated 12.000 pens to primary schools in 5 municipalities, giving the opportunity to improve children education.



Education about hydraulic infrastructure Sedhiou Senegal

Organs and technical offices of Sedhiou region received specific training on proper planning and maintenance of hydraulic infrastructure in Casamance and best monitoring and solving process against saline intrusion phenomenon.



Protection of Natural Resources Sedhiou, Senegal

We consider importance and protection of the territory as an essential matter to deal with, and for that reason we held lessons in 35 schools addressing about 15,000 children.



Risks and Problems of Clandestine Immigration Arrossendissment de Simbandi, Senegal

Risk and problems connected to clandestin immigration has been discussed during meeting organized in more than 10 villages, in order to reduce its impact among youngers and avoid the loss of people unaware of real difficulties, but also sharing actual aspects of the phenomenon and refugees' rights.
